CONSENT APPLICATIONS

B02-21 - 289-291 Albert Street - Planner: Victoria Nikoltcheva



Purpose: The purpose of this application is to re-establish the lot line between 289 Albert Street and 291 Albert Street, which inadvertently merged on title by way of both lots being held under the same ownership name. The lands are to retain their original boundaries, frontages and setbacks before the lots merged. Each lot will have a frontage of 9.87m and an area of 358.8m².

MINOR VARIANCE APPLICATIONS

A04-21 - 289-291 Albert Street - Planner: Victoria Nikoltcheva



Purpose: The applicant has requested Minor Variances under Section 44 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990. The purpose of the requested variances are to reduce the aggregate side yard width for 291 Albert Street, as well as reduce the side yard setbacks and frontages for both properties to facilitate a severance of the parcel that has merged in title.

Variances requested:

289 Albert Street

- 1. To reduce the frontage to 9.87m from the minimum required 10m.
- 2. To reduce the easterly side yard setback to 0.93m from the minimum required 1m.

291 Albert Street

- 1. To reduce the frontage to 9.87m from the minimum required 14m.
- 2. To reduce the westerly side yard setback to 0.14m from the minimum required 1m.
- 3. To reduce the aggregate side yard width to 1.72m from the minimum required 2m.

A05-21 – 317 Cobourg Street - Planner: Victoria Nikoltcheva



Purpose: The applicant has requested a Minor Variance under Section 44 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990. The purpose of the Minor Variance is to reduce the frontage and area to facilitate the proposed use of the property as a converted dwelling.

Variances requested:

- 1. To reduce the minimum required frontage from 15m to 12.19m for the proposed use.
- 2. To reduce the minimum required area from 450m² to 444.7m² for the proposed use.

A06-21 - 195 William Street - Planner: Victoria Nikoltcheva



Purpose: The applicant has requested a Minor Variance under Section 44 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990. The purpose of the Minor Variance is to reduce the front yard depth and increase the lot coverage to construct a single detached dwelling on the vacant property.

Variances requested:

- 1. To reduce the front yard depth to 1.4m from the minimum required 7.5m.
- 2. To increase the lot coverage to 46.5% from the maximum required 35%.

A07-21 - 197 William Street - Planner: Victoria Nikoltcheva



Purpose: The applicant has requested a Minor Variance under Section 44 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990. The purpose of the Minor Variance is to reduce the front yard depth and increase the lot coverage to construct a single detached dwelling on the vacant property.

Variances requested:

- 1. To reduce the front yard depth to 1.5m from the minimum required 7.5m.
- 2. To increase the lot coverage to 48.6% from the maximum required 35%.

A08-21 - 590 Forman Avenue - Planner: Victoria Nikoltcheva



Purpose: The applicant has requested a Minor Variance under Section 44 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990. The purpose of the Minor Variance is to reduce the minimum rear yard depth to accommodate a screen porch with steps.

Variances requested:

 To reduce the minimum rear yard depth from 6m to 2.87m to allow for the proposed screen porch and steps.

A09-21 - 40 Britannia Street - Planner: Victoria Nikoltcheva



Purpose: The purpose of this Minor Variance application under Section 44 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990 is to reduce the required side yard setbacks to accommodate an attic renovation.

Variances requested:

- Reduce the required minimum setback of 2m for a 3-storey building to 1.5m along the west property line
- 3. Reduce the required minimum setback of 2m for a 3-storey building to 0.25m along the east property

A10-21 - 111 Lakeside Drive - Planner: Jeff Bannon



Purpose: The purpose of this application under Section 44 of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990 is to reduce the minimum number of parking spaces to be made available to the public for the subject lands.

Variances requested: To reduce the minimum number of parking spaces to be made available to the public from 166 to 131 for the 2021 Stratford Festival Season

This will also entitle you to be advised of a possible Local Planning Appeal Tribunal hearing. Even if you are the successful party, you should request a copy of the decision since the Stratford Committee of Adjustment decision may be appealed to the Local Planning Appeal Tribunal by the applicant or another member of the public.
