**Architectural Description:** storey and a half, red brick; hipped gable roof, with a small peak on the front slope of the roof in the centre; it is a five bay house with a centre door flanked by sidelights with a transom above the door; the windows are like French windows with a heavy centre muntin and six panes over six panes; the front porch is partly enclosed on the left side with three six over one paned windows; with a shingle railing wall; the right side of the porch is open; the hipped roof is supported by square posts that rest on the porch wall at the front of the porch and half round columns are attached to the wall at the back of the porch; a small gable sits in the centre of the roof of the porch; the gable

on the main roof is directly above this gable; the right hand wall of the house has two French style windows identical to the ones at the front and two smaller rectangular windows in the upstairs.

The Reverend Thomas MacPherson lived here. He was responsible for the establishment of the Free Presbyterian Church in Stratford.
