Architectural Description: two storey brick painted grey with a gable roofed section on each end connected by a traverse section; first floor; left side rectangular two over two part window with shutters; the traverse part is recessed; the entrance door is at the left side with a three paned transom above it; the window to the right of the door is rectangular two panes over one pane; with shutters; the right hand side window in the gabled portion of the house is the same as the one on the left side. second storey; a rectangular one over one paned window with shutters in each gable section; the centre traverse section has been filled in with an enclosed porch with one window on each side and six windows at the front; each peak has a plain square drop finial. The left hand wall has two rectangular

windows in the second storey and one smaller two part window in the first storey towards the back of the wall.

The house was probably erected by Thomas Lunn, a Stratford contractor.
